I am concerned especially that if released he may come in contact with female members of my family and cause them harm. How can we heal when we are compelled to write letters, make appearances, dig up painful feelings & memories and basically re-live this crime every few years. How can you be sure that if he is released he would not continue the same behavior and endanger more innocent people. I believe that he has not been rehabilitated no matter how many classes & therapy sessions he has taken inside of prison. We must protect society from dangerous manipulative people with no respect for human life like Raul is and quite possibly will be outside of the prison environment. Please ease our family's pain & heartbreak by not releasing this man from prison.
